As Historians we will...
be jumping into our time machine, setting the dial to around 3 million B.C. and travelling to the Stone Age and Bronze Age before stopping off at the Iron Age. How did Neolithic hunter gatherers live? What does Stonehenge and Skara Brae tell us about how we lived when we hunted wild animals and lived in caves? Hop in and find out.

As Geographers we will...
(there is no geography topic this half term)

As Thinkers in RE we will...
be starting to learn about both Christianity and Islam, focusing on the 5 pillars of Islam and religious celebrations. We hope you will join us at our Harvest Festival.

As Thinkers in PSHE we will...
be looking at new beginnings, creating our own classroom rules and celebrating the things that make us unique. We will be thinking of big ideas during our Philosophy for Children sessions and using Peer Massage to encourage mindfulness and relaxation.

In Literacy we will...
learn how to write detailed character descriptions; create imaginative settings and narrative. We will use drama to help take on the roles of these characters and understand how they feel. We will also create diaries of characters' lives and recent events. We will be using our Talk for Writing skills to create a non-fiction report about animals or our own creation. We will also take part in guided reading to develop comprehension and appreciation skills; we will also develop our spelling. We will continue to develop our neat handwriting joins so look out for our fantastic curves.

As Scientists we will...
be thinking about what animals and humans need to stay healthy. We will explore the main foods groups. P-----, C-----, F---- and V-----, F--- and S----- and D----. We will also find out about the human skeleton, remember the 'the arm bone's connected to the shoulder bone. Now 'shake dem skeleton bones!'

As Computer Scientists we will...
be combining text and graphics to create a poster and a presentation all about our favourite people (ourselves.)

As Linguists we will...
be looking at the difference between le chat et le chien. Do you know your le from your la and les? With help from masculine and feminine nouns you soon will.

As Sportspeople we will...
be 'hip, hop and healthy' as we look at creating our dances and invasion tactic in ball skills. All classes will also be making a 'splash' at Waves in the Autumn term.

In Maths we will...
begin to investigate place value to at least 1000. We will use a variety of practical equipment to help us understand place value and solve number and practical problems. We be mentally adding and subtracting numbers from a 3-digit number. We will learn the formal written methods of column addition and subtraction. We will then use these skills to add and subtract decimals using the context of money. Throughout Year 3 we will be working on our recall of the 3, 4, 6 and 8 times tables.

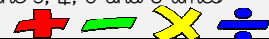
As Artists we will...
